


Kensington & Chelsea Bookshop Crawl

World's End Books




This route takes in several very unique bookshops and can be done entirely on foot. Start at South Kensington Books (22 Thurloe St, SW7 2LT), which is full of new and bargain books. When you've browsed to your hearts' content, take a short walk to Sokol Books (239A Fulham Rd, SW3 6HY), a rare and antiquarian bookshop specialising in English and Continental books published up to 1600, although they are closed in preparation for a book fair so you'll have to look in from outside! Another short walk will bring you to World's End Books (357 King's Road, SW3 5ES), a carefully curated shop of second hand wonders.



If you'd like a mid - route break, BookBar Chelsea (11 Chelsea Manor St, SW3 3TW) is the place for it! One of the newer additions to London's literary landscape, this beautiful and cosy bookshop has a spacious cafe with comfy seating alongside the intriguing collection of books. It's also fully accessible and has a toilet, just fyi.

From here, continue your walk and it will take you past Waterstones (158 King's Road, SW3 3NR) and finally onto one of London's most deservedly photographed bookshops, John Sandoe Books (10 Blacklands Terrace, SW3 2SR), where you are likely to lose hours even though it looks small, as the shop is absolutely stacked with beautiful and interesting books across all genres.

Once you're finished, this route easily joins up with the bookshops of Notting Hill, when taking the District Line from Sloane Square.
